

Mountable printable placard with headband

The present invention discloses a resilient headband arcuate in shape for being mounted on the head of the user. The headband is equipped with a longitudinal slotted member for holding a placard therein, in a generally upright standing manner which placard can have written thereon on one side a thought balloon and on the opposite side a speech balloon. The slotted member is equipped with teeth-like holding appendages which grasp the placard and secure it to the slotted member.

Vehicular impact signaling device

An apparatus for the deployment of a visible plume to alert other motorists that a proximate motor vehicle has been involved in a collision is described as having a tube which is open at one end disposed at the top and closed at a distal end. The distal end houses an activation device that is used to detonate an explosive charge in response to the detection of an output signal.

The output signal is generated by a sensor subsequent to the motor vehicle experiencing an impact of

sufficient magnitude. Both the sensor and the output signal are compatible with current technologies used to detect impacts which result in the deployment of air bags, and accordingly the device may rely upon these systems as may already be installed in the motor vehicle.

The explosive charge expels a signaling media above the motor vehicle in a plume above the motor vehicle to visually alert other motorists that a collision has occurred. The plume rises to a preferred height of approximately 60 feet, making it readily visible to the other motorists in the area.


The signaling media includes a powder, liquid, or pyrotechnic device. The pyrotechnic device produces a momentary highly visible flare. An audible signal is generated by incorporating an explosive pyrotechnic device, such as a firecracker, within the signaling media.



Hair restoring method and apparatus for carrying out the same

A hair restoring apparatus comprises a helmet-like cap having a sealing ring formed around a brim portion into which compressed air is supplied, and provided with an air inlet/outlet, steam inlets and hair restorer inlets. A pneumatic machine is connected to the air inlet/outlet of the cap and to the sealing ring formed around the brim portion of the cap by way of pipes, a steam generator is connected to the steam inlets of the cap by way of pipes, and a hair restorer supply unit for storing a hair restorer is connected to the hair restorer inlets of the cap by way of pipes.

The cap is put on the head to form a sealed space between the cap and the head, steam is jetted into the sealed space after evacuating the latter to expand and to clean portions of the scalp around hair roots, a hair restorer is jetted into the evacuated, sealed space, and then compressed air is jetted into the sealed space to promote the penetration of the hair restorer into the portions of the scalp around hair roots.



An Insect destruction device in the form of miniature hand operated slingshot. The apparatus consists of an elastic band that can be used as shown in the drawing by tensioning the band with the thumb, aiming at the insect to be destroyed and then hitting the insect with it by releasing the elastic band.

Additional features include elastics tinted in bright colors, optional use with either the right or the left hand and convenience, since no missiles are necessary given that the insect is smitten with the actual elastic band.



Method and apparatus for making a drink hop along a bar or counter


